## Star News 10 July 2022

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

We are living in a world that is growing daily further and further away from God. The Sacred Scriptures constantly remind us of the loving unbroken care of God towards human persons. He created everything for man and for his well-being. His concern for human persons is incomparable. He sent his messengers constantly to look after his people. He is given to us as our Father, caretaker and protector. The image of God

as the shepherd of his people has a long tradition in the history of God's people. Today's Gospel reminds us that we are the instruments of God and we ought to help those in need even though they are unlike us and even if we dislike them. Jesus' choice of the Samaritan as the hero of his story may have made his audience wince. Even the Lawyer in the story does not use his name in his response but he only says the one who showed mercy. Jesus teaches us through the parable of the Good Samaritan that God's grace comes to us in all forms and through all kinds of people. Let us open our hearts and eyes to receive God's grace.

Let us remember that the road from Jerusalem to Jericho passes right through our home, parish, school and workplace. We may find our spouse, children or parents lying "wounded" by bitter words or scathing criticism or by other more blatant forms of verbal, emotional or physical abuse. Hence, Jesus invites us to show our love to others, in our own home, in school, in the workplace and in the neighbourhood, as the Good Samaritan did.

Let us check to see if we are good neighbours. We become good neighbours when we are people of generosity, kindness and mercy toward all who are suffering. Our sincere smile, a cheery greeting, an encouraging word of appreciation, a heartfelt "thank you" can all work wonders for a suffering soul.

Let us allow the "Good Samaritans" to touch our lives. Let us be willing to touch, or be touched by, persons we have once despised. For some of us, it may be persons of another colour or race; for others, it may mean persons of a different political persuasion. Let us pray that the Spirit of the Living God may melt us, mould us and use us, so that there will no longer be even one person who is untouchable or outside the boundaries of compassion.

Today's Gospel is asking us to check our lives and to see who needs our love and care. It also challenges us to become a good neighbour. So, let us ask to ourselves- Am I a good neighbour?



## **NAIDOC Week**

NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee. To understand what all that means though, we need a little bit of a history lesson. In 1955, the Day of mourning or Aborigines Day was moved from the Sunday before January 26 to the first Sunday in July. It was shifted because people wanted to focus more on celebrating First Nations cultures rather than protesting. The National Aborigines Day Observance committee was then created in 1956 to organize national events. In 1975 it was decided to celebrate for a whole week rather than just one day. NAIDOC week was born! Then in 1991, NAIDOC Week expanded to recognise Torres Strait Islander people and cultures. And that's why it's called NAIDOC Week.

**Why is NAIDOC Week important?** NAIDOC Week is important as it is an opportunity for learning, connection and community. It gives First Nations people and non-Indigenous people the opportunity to celebrate and connect with community and country. It is a chance for everyone not just First Nations people to celebrate all aspects of First Nations history and cultures. As well as this, with its origins of being one of the first major civil rights gatherings in the World. NAIDOC Week is an important time to reflect on the challenges faced by First Nations people – to look at how far we have come and how far we have to go.
