

Dear Friends,

Have you ever wondered where Thomas was when Jesus appeared to the 'other disciples'? They were huddled together with the doors firmly locked because they feared the Jews. And yet Thomas wasn't with them. Some scripture scholars think that Thomas was so brokenhearted when Jesus was crucified and buried, that he just wanted to be alone with his grief.

Not an unusual reaction when we receive the sad news of the death of someone close to us. 'Let me

be alone'. Even though we may be physically present to others we so often draw back within ourselves, with our thoughts.

When we think of Thomas we always think of him as a 'doubter' but he is never called that in the Gospel. We know he was called the 'twin' but who was his twin? Never mentioned. John's Gospel shows Thomas to be a kind person who, a little like Peter, blurts out questions or comments that others are too timid or too embarrassed to speak. He is certainly a person of courage.

When Jesus said that he was going to Bethany when the news of Lazarus' illness had come to him, Thomas knew that going to that hostile place would almost certainly mean the death of Jesus. His only wish for himself and the other apostles was to go with Jesus and die with him. Maybe he wasn't gathered with the doors locked for fear of the Jews because he didn't fear the Jews. At the Last Supper he is honest enough to say that none of the disciples have any idea where Jesus is heading (John 14:5). It is interesting to note that the disciples to whom the risen Lord appeared on Easter eve announce the resurrection to Thomas in the same words as Mary Magdalene spoke to them: "We have seen the Lord." And they are as unsuccessful in convincing Thomas as Mary had been with them. Like all disciples, Thomas needs a personal experience of Jesus risen before he will believe. Before he can believe.

So eight days later, on the next “first day of the week”, the risen Jesus again stands in the midst of his disciples, greets them again with his peace and invites Thomas to stretch out his hand and touch the wounds of his hands and side.

Thomas now has no need to touch. Jesus’ personal presence and offer to touch is enough to demolish all his doubt. Here is the way, and the truth and the life that Thomas is seeking and he responds with the most profound and personal assent of faith in the Gospels: “My Lord and my God!”

We should not remember Thomas as the ‘doubter’ but as ‘the great believer’.

For all generations who will listen to this Gospel in the presence of the physically absent Jesus, the last beatitude that Jesus then addresses to Thomas is our greatest hope: “Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed”.

It is to hand on such life-giving faith that John says that he has written his Gospel.

We are Easter people and the resurrection story is our story.

We are sent out today to take and be the ‘good news’ that Jesus is risen! Let us be that Good News!



