Dear Friends,

Amos was the earliest of the prophets to have his words and works preserved in writing. He was born in the Southern Kingdom of Judah and made his living tending sheep and caring for sycamore trees. About 750 BC Amos was called by God and sent into the Northern Kingdom to speak the Lord's word during the prosperous reign of King Jeroboan II. In today's reading we see Amos in controversy.

Bethel was one of the major shrines in the Northern

Kingdom and it had special connections with the king. The priest in charge of this shrine was Amaziah and he confronts Amos, who has come up from the Southern Kingdom and is preaching against the king and the practices of the kingdom right here in the precincts of the king's shrine. As our reading opens Amaziah is trying to get rid of Amos, to go back home and stop embarrassing the king and the people in Bethel.

"Get back to the land of Judah; earn your bread there, do your prophesying there."

Amos replies that he is not here to earn a living, he is not a professional prophet asking a fee for services. In fact he is a country boy, "a shepherd and dresser of sycamores."

He is a prophet at the command of God and is here because God has sent him. His message is God's.

As we listen to this reading from Amos and the Gospel of Mark today we hear that both Amos and the twelve were sent out to do their preaching by God. Just as Amos contends that he is not in the prophecy business for what he can get out of it, so also Jesus warns his apostles not to be worried about their personal comfort as they are sent out to preach repentance. "Take nothing for the journey except a staff..."

So they set off to preach repentance, and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them." We are very familiar with the 'anointing with oil' in the sacrament of the anointing of the sick and it is interesting to note that this is the only reference in the Gospels to the anointing of the sick with oil.

The only other reference to anointing with oil is in the Letter of James, written at about the same time or slightly before Mark's Gospel. It seems clear that this was a practice in at least some of the Christian Communities.

The disciples were to go out in such utter simplicity, complete trust and phenomenal generosity that they weren't to take much more than the clothes on their backs and they were always to give of themselves expecting nothing in return beyond hospitality. The message they took was the message of Jesus calling the people to a conversion of heart and a total radical reorientation – away from self and in the direction of intense service of God and one another.

Amos was not a professional prophet like other 'false prophets' of his day, who said what the king wanted to hear. He was a farmer, ill equipped to be God's spokesman but obedient to God's call.

Just like the apostles, several being fishermen, at least one a tax collector, but none of them having any particular 'religious' credentials that would make them obvious choices to carry out Jesus' mission of spreading the good news to all people.

We are all called to be disciples of Jesus, those who continue to take the 'good news' of Jesus to the people of our times.

How ill-equipped do we feel to face this challenge. And yet, like Amos and the apostles, the only qualification we need is an open heart to discern God's call and a willingness to respond.


