

Dear Friends,

Today's Gospel contains the parable of the tiny mustard seed that grows into a large shrub that can shelter the birds of the air. Our First Reading from the prophet Ezekiel has a similar image.

It's only after hearing the reading of the Gospel that it becomes clear why the reading from Ezekiel was chosen. Have you ever wondered how the readings for the Mass are chosen? The Gospel Reading is chosen first. And in this Year B we are reading the Gospel of Mark. After the

Gospel text has been chosen, a reading from the Old Testament is selected that has a connection or a similar theme to the Gospel. As the seed takes time to grow so the farmer needs patience. We at Mass need to patiently listen to the whole of the Liturgy of the Word, the First Reading, the Responsorial Psalm, the Second Reading and the Gospel to better understand the connections.

Jesus was raised on the stories and messages of the Old Testament and as he preaches his parable today we wonder whether he had today's passage from Ezekiel in mind.

Ezekiel belonged to a priestly family in the sixth century BC. Because of his prominent position among the people he was deported to Babylon in 597 BC, ten years before the final destruction of Jerusalem. In Babylon he is called by God to be his prophet where he is faithfully proclaiming the message of God when the Babylonians finally destroyed Jerusalem and the Kingdom of Judah in 587 BC. Overall, Ezekiel's message was a word of hope, an assurance that even though a sinful people had contributed to bring their present disaster on themselves, God would rescue them and bring them to a new life in a renewed homeland. Ezekiel tells a fable about how an eagle takes the topmost branch out of a cedar tree and plants it in a foreign land where not much growth could be expected.

When the time is ripe, God too will take a shoot from the top of the cedar tree, that represents his people. God will plant the shoot in an appropriate place where it will grow and flourish. It will become a majestic tree, capable of giving shade and shelter to all the birds of the earth. This tree would demonstrate the power of God to do what he wants with the tree that represents his people. The flourishing tree that grows out of the tender shoot planted by God, represents the new people returning to their homeland where the sad political circumstances would be replaced by a rigorous new kingdom.

It's easy to see the fulfillment of Ezekiel's prophecy in the Kingdom of God that Jesus preaches in today's Gospel. In two parables about the Kingdom of God, Jesus speaks about the seeds that grow to harvest without the farmer really understanding what is going on. We hear of the mustard seed which grows into a tree so big that the birds can shelter in its branches.

None of us fully understands how the Kingdom of God grows and flourishes. It is beyond our comprehension. The Kingdom of God in the two parables is the rule of God in our lives and the way that God continues to work in our lives and in our world. While the mystery of nature's growth is all around us, it is also within us.

Each of today's readings indicates that growth comes from God, but we are responsible for working it out. The power, the grace of God can do great things in those who are weak.

We pray today that we, who are small, will play our part in building the Kingdom of God. God offers us visions of a happy future and he is always with us to help us in the building.

We rejoice with the children who are celebrating their First Communion at the 10.30am Mass today.

May they continue to grow in their love for God as their lives continue to be touched by Jesus' love in the gift of himself in Eucharist.

Rehearsal - Thursday 26th August at 4.30pm - Sacrament of Confirmation: Thursday 2nd September.




