Dear Friends,

Today, we celebrate the solemn **Feast of Corpus Christi**. It is three feasts in one: the feast of the Eucharistic Sacrifice, the feast of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, and the feast of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. This doctrinal feast has been established for three purposes. Firstly, to give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist and to honour Him there; secondly, to instruct the people in the Mystery, Faith, and devotion surrounding the

Eucharist, and finally, to teach us to appreciate and make use of the great gift of the Holy Eucharist, both as a Sacrament and as a sacrifice. The Feast sums up **three important confessions about our Faith**. **First is that God became physically present in the person of Christ**, True God and True Man. **Secondly, God continues to be present in His people in the form of the Mystical Body of Christ in his church**. **Thirdly, the presence of God under the form of bread and wine is made available to us on the altar at Mass** and preserved there for our nourishment and worship.

The Lord's Supper ensures that we can remember Jesus from any place. Apollo 11 landed on the moon on Sunday, July 20, 1969. Most remember astronaut Neil Armstrong's first words as he stepped onto the moon's surface: *"That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."* But few know about the first meal eaten on the moon. Dennis Fisher reports that Buzz Aldrin, the NASA Astronaut had taken aboard the spacecraft a tiny pyx provided by his Catholic pastor. Aldrin sent a radio broadcast to Earth asking listeners to contemplate the events of the day and give thanks. Then, blacking out the broadcast for privacy, Aldrin read, "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit." Then, silently, he gave thanks for their successful journey to the moon and received Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, surrendering the moon to Jesus. Next, he descended on the moon and walked on it with Neil Armstrong. (*Dan Gulley: "Communion on the Moon": Our Daily Bread: June/July/August 2007*). Aldrin's actions remind us that in the Lord's Supper, God's children can share the life of Jesus from any place on Earth, even from the moon. God is everywhere, and our worship should reflect this reality. In Psalm 139, we read that wherever we go, God is intimately present with us. Buzz Aldrin celebrated that experience on the surface of the moon. Thousands of miles from earth, he took time to commune with the One who created, redeemed, and established fellowship with him.

The feast of Corpus Christi asks us to become Christ-bearers and conveyers. By receiving Holy Communion, we have to become Christ-bearers as Mary was, with the duty of conveying Christ to others at home and in the workplace, as love, mercy, forgiveness, and humble and sacrificial service.
