PENTECOST

Dear Friends.

The great feast of Pentecost is commonly called the birthday of the Church. It's the festival celebration of our New Covenant with God. It's the feast of the Holy Spirit and we honour the Spirit's coming among us on this day. It's a celebration of our own particular giftedness: there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit who gives them. And it's the last Sunday of the Easter Season.

Our Reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells of how the Holy Spirit exploded into the lives of the Apostles huddled in fear in that locked room. The Spirit came in power symbolised by the strong wind and the tongues of fire. The cowering Apostles needed the strength and fire of the Spirit to go out and face the crowds they'd previously feared. To take the message of Jesus to the world, they desperately needed the Holy Spirit. The fire that came upon the Apostles was in the form of tongues, because the gift that God was now giving would be a gift of speech. The Apostles were being empowered to speak with the tongue of God. And they did speak in many languages.

A large crowd had gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Feast of Weeks, when the Jews offered thanks for the wheat harvest. They also celebrated the gift of the law to Moses on Mt Sinai. The people had come from all over. Practically any place you could think of was represented there.

But although the languages were different and the homelands were many, they all heard the same thing: the Apostles speaking of "the mighty acts of God."

What the Apostles had to say was addressed to people from all over the world. From the very beginning, the Church was universal. The events of that first Pentecost took place in an exclusive context of Judaism. The people were from all over the world, but they were all Jews, either by birth or by conversion. This would change. The rest of the Acts of the Apostles is the story of how the Church grew and changed to become an all embracing community. The Church of today is the same Church that had its beginning on that day in Jerusalem and it continues to grow and develop.

Let us remember and celebrate that the same Spirit that came upon the Apostles, sending them out to proclaim the Gospel to all the world, is upon each of us. In our weakness and fear, the Holy Spirit is our strength as we strive to live and witness to Jesus Christ, who died and is risen. We remember particularly the day of our Confirmation.

Several members of our community have been growing in their Catholic faith as they journeyed through our **RCIA Program** led and guided by Peter Hunter. Amanda Cutlack will be baptised and Cindy Lee, Sarra Bennett, Rebecca Newman, Douglas Jones and Vivian Jones will be received into the Catholic Church. They will all be Confirmed and celebrate their First Communion. Please rejoice with them and keep them in your prayers.

VOLUNTEERS: the whole of last week we have been celebrating Volunteers in our society. Without volunteers, how would our society cope? It simply wouldn't. We, at Star of the Sea, can only be the caring community we are because of the many wonderful volunteers. 

NATIONAL SORRY DAY 26th May 2021



The first **National Sorry Day** was held on **May 26, 1998**, which was one year after the tabling of a report about the removal of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children from their families. The report, known as **Bringing Them Home**, acknowledged that Indigenous children were forcibly separated from their families and communities since the early days of European occupation in Australia. Governments and missionaries were responsible for this forced separation. Symbol used today and is worn on the 26th May is the Native Hibiscus. The flower was adopted because it is found widely distributed across Australia and it is a survivor, as are the scattered members of the stolen generations.

27th May – 3rd June 2021 National Reconciliation Week



Action painted by Jessica Johnson, is the story of the land and community sharing the united Call for action on reconciliation. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island peoples have been listening to the heartbeat of the land and sea for generations. With their rainbow shaped souls the Spirits ask for us to join and make reconciliation more than a word, take action. We need to love one another and every aspect of the existing environment and community – we all have a role to play. Our Parish is holding a National Reconciliation Week Event following the 8:30am Mass on Sunday 30th May, everyone is welcome.
