

Dear Friends,

God acts in mysterious ways in many places in the Old Testament but the story of Abraham being asked to sacrifice his son, Isaac, renders God's ways almost completely incomprehensible. For this Sunday we have an abridged version of the story which omits many of the details that occur in the full text from Genesis. At the Easter Vigil each year we always read this dramatic story in full and this story of God asking Abraham to sacrifice his son, is one of only five Old Testament stories that are read more than once during the year.

The first sentence of our reading clearly announces the purpose for what God asks of Abraham: to put Abraham to the test. God has spoken to Abraham many times, usually words of encouragement and promise, but this demand to "offer up your son Isaac to me in sacrifice" is something most bewildering. Abraham has been told by God that he is to be the father of many nations and this was to take place through this son of Sarah and Abraham. God seems to be telling Abraham now to cut the link between himself and his promised future. God's messenger, seeing Abraham's willingness to obey, calls on him to spare the boy. Instead of Isaac, Abraham offers God a ram that was nearby for sacrifice.

There are several levels of significance in this disturbing story. Sacrificing a child to a local divinity was not unusual for the Canaanites among whom the Israelites lived and it seems clear that some Israelites, who had slipped into idolatry, also engaged in this practice. God is telling his people that human sacrifice is not an acceptable religious practice for those who worshipped the one true God.

More importantly, the story was meant to offer a stunning example of Abrahams' trust in God. It's important for us reading this story in 2021, to realize that the main point of the story is not what Abraham must have thought about sacrificing his son, but what Abraham must have thought about God. He knew what God had promised him and he knew the part that Isaac was to play in the fulfillment of that promise. Yet against every human sentiment, against a seemingly irrational demand on God's part, Abraham trusted in God. If God is incomprehensible, Abraham's steadfast faith and trust stands out more boldly.

Let us now put the sacrifice of Isaac in our First Reading side by side with our Second Reading from Romans which speaks of how God "did not spare his own Son." In Jesus' death, God is not the one to demand the sacrifice but the one to make the sacrifice. In the Jesus story, God is more like Abraham than like God in the Isaac story. So what made God believe in us? God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us.


As we still struggle to understand God's incomprehensible ways, in what he asked of Abraham, how hard it is to truly understand that God's love for us, sinners though we are, is so great that he willingly gave his Son Jesus to live and to die for us. God's love for each of each one of us is beyond our understanding but each time we look at the beautiful cross in Star of the Sea Church we face the reality of God's love.

The Star of the Sea Sacramental Program began on Wednesday with a meeting of parents whose children are preparing to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The children will be enrolled in their preparation at all the Masses this weekend. Keep these children and their families in your prayers as they come to experience the love of God through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



This year's Theme is **"Build on a Strong Foundation"**.


