Dear friends,

The central theme of this 4th Sunday is that, when we face hatred and rejection because of our Christian Faith, we need to have, and show, the courage of our Christian convictions in our day-to-day lives in our communities. The first reading tells us how God called Jeremiah as His prophet and equipped him to face opposition and rejection. In living out his prophetic vocation, while encountering rejection and persecution, Jeremiah prefigured Jesus, the greatest of all prophets. The Responsorial

Psalm, Ps 71, offers us a prayer in time of persecution and a declaration of our trust in God with its foundation in Him.

In the second reading, we hear Paul speaking with the courage of his Christian convictions in correcting the Corinthian Christian community, There the exercise of God's gifts was causing competition, jealousy, and divisiveness. He courageously presents to them a 'way' which surpasses all others, namely, the way of love, and instructs them to exercise their gifts with love.

Today's Gospel is a continuation of last Sunday's Gospel where there was negative reaction to Jesus, when he spoke at the synagogue of Nazareth, from his own people. Jesus applied to himself the words of Isaiah 61, announcing a new time of jubilee, liberation, and healing in God's name. The passage shows us how Jesus faced scepticism and criticism with prophetic courage.

Jeremiah, Paul, and Jesus believed that they were commissioned by God to pro-claim a disturbing prophetic message (Jer 1:4-5, 17-19). No matter how strong the opposition, the three had the conviction that God was with them.

Dear Friends, how deep is our conviction that God has commissioned us and is with us always.

On 31 January the Church commemorates the feast of **St John Bosco** also known as Don Bosco. Saint John Bosco is the patron saint of apprentices, editors and publishers, schoolchildren, magicians, and juvenile delinquents.

On February 2 we celebrate the feast of the "**Presentation of the Lord**" which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus. It is also known as Candlemas day, since the blessing and procession of candles is included in today's liturgy. The festival was formerly known in the Catholic Church as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted this day also to pray for women and men in consecrated life.

February 5 is the feast of **St. Agatha**, also known as Agatha of Sicily, a venerated virgin martyr. From her early years, the notably beautiful Agatha dedicated her life to God. St. Agatha is the patron saint of Sicily, breast cancer patients, rape victims, and nurses.

February 1-7 is **World Interfaith Harmony Week**. The General Assembly of UN pointed out that mutual understanding and interreligious dialogue constitute important dimensions of a culture of peace and established World Interfaith Harmony Week as a way to promote harmony between all people regardless of their faith.

The God of peace is always with us to bless our families and ministries. So, let us listen to St Paul and practice the 'Way of Love'.

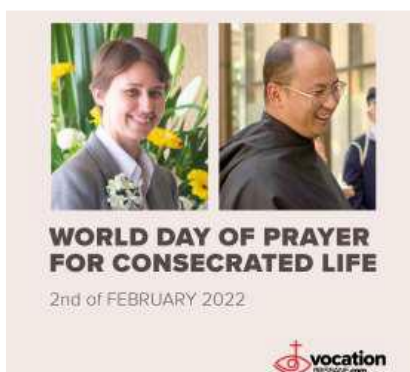

New prayer reflection resource for Lent and the Easter Octave 2022, titled **The Spirit and the Cross**, printed in a handy pocket-size format.

Each day includes a scripture reading, a reflection upon it, some questions to aid prayer and discussion, and quotes from Pope Francis.

The daily reflections, written by Dcn Peter Pellicaan, invite the reader to contemplate a verse from the Scripture reading of the day, and offers questions for reflection and discussion.

The daily reflections will only require 5-10 minutes for a person to read, reflect and pray. This Lenten practice will lead the reader into a deeper questioning and examination of their daily life. As they encounter both **The Spirit and the Cross** – in their families, workplaces and the community – they will walk as ‘missionary disciples’ on the path to Easter, and beyond.
