Dear friends,  
'Break Open the Word' is a Liturgy resource produced by Liturgy Brisbane whose aim is to help Readers for Sunday Mass be well prepared for their reading. It includes the full text of the readings with a pronunciation guide for unusual words and names, plus a commentary on each reading. It has proved to be very helpful for readers around Australia and overseas. All Readers at Star of the sea are encouraged to use 'Break Open the Word'.

The Readings we hear on Sunday are not always easy

to understand, some are quite complex and in order to read them with meaning it is important to understand them.

Hence the importance of preparation. Often, the Second Reading on Sunday is from the Letters of St Paul, many of which are inspirational, rich in meaning, filled with beautiful expressions of the love of God. Occasionally, like today's Reading, we almost cringe as we listen to a message that seems inappropriate for our age.

Break Open the Word's comment on today's Reading says: "Some readers may feel uncomfortable proclaiming today's passage from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. He plainly argues that marriage is a distraction from devotion to the Lord. Husbands and wives must put energy into pleasing one another rather than giving 'undivided attention to the Lord'. The unmarried, on the other hand, only have to worry about being holy in body and spirit.' Such teaching goes against the Church's contemporary understanding of marriage as the primary matrix for us to live out our discipleship of Jesus. Paul's advice must be interpreted in the light of his conviction that the end times were at hand." (Break Open the Word 2021).

We know how highly Jesus himself regarded marriage and he used marriage to explain the intimate relationship between Him and the Church.

(Liturgy of the Word with Communion – every other Sunday at 9am)



At the time of Paul's writing of this Letter, Christians and Paul himself, were expecting the second coming of Christ at any moment. The time was very near. It was in this light that Paul wrote that virginity was a nobler calling than marriage. He wasn't contradicting a person's freedom to marry and he wrote that he had no desire to impose a restraint upon married people or those planning to marry but as the end was near, his advice was to put God and the relationship with God before everything else.

The question is asked whether Paul's advice would be true for times when there was no evidence of Jesus' second coming? We, of course, can only speculate, but his belief that the time was near clearly influences his expression in today's extract.

It doesn't seem right, however, to suggest that today, a spouseless and childless life is free of worry. I and many single people can testify to that, just as celibacy and virginity are no guarantee of wholehearted devotion to the Lord. According to reports, there is no great evidence that all husbands are overwhelmingly concerned with pleasing their wives or wives their husbands. We know very well that among married people we find some of the holiest people and among the clergy and religious some of the most ordinary. The most important goal for everyone, in all times and in all circumstances, is, in Paul's words, that we be devoted to God.

Paul has been condemned in some quarters as being antimarriage and antiwomen, but it is important to understand why he says what he says. He was a man of his time and some of his writings jar on the modern ear but we need to get behind his words to his motivation which today is that nothing in life is more important than our relationship with God. Whether we be married, single or celibate we are all called to grow in our relationship with God. We are all called to be holy, no more in the monastery or the presbytery than in the home. Our journey to God, for all of us, began in the home, for you and me and Paul.

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## **PARISH NEWS**



Ash Wednesday is the first day in the Christian Season of **Lent**, and begins about 40 days before Easter. The 40 days of Lent represent Jesus' time in the desert and the 40 years the Israelites spent in exile. In the Bible the number 40 is symbolic.

The ashes are traditionally the burnt palms from last year's Palm Sunday, and worn by Catholics and other Christians as a sign of repentance, humility and renouncing pride, which is why when the ashes are distributed it is proclaimed: "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" or "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return".

Ash Wednesday is the day when many Christian focus their attention on three practices: fasting, praying and almsgiving.

Why we fast? Depriving ourselves of basic necessity reminds us of our utter dependence on God.

Why we give? What we are given by God is meant not just for us, but for us to share with others.

Why we pray? We are not totally self-sufficient. We have a need inside that cannot be filled by us or others. We have a holy longing and must look to God.
