## Star News 26 June 2022

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

Today's Scriptures are about announcing the Good News. They remind us that announcing the Good News of the Kingdom by words, deeds, and life is not the task of only a few. Rather, it is a task for all baptized Christians.

In the first reading, Isaiah announces the good news to the returned Babylonian exiles that the ruined and desolate Jerusalem will take care of them "as a mother comforts her baby

son." Isaiah assures the returned Jews that they will live in the certainty of Yahweh's promises of love, protection, prosperity, and salvation. In today's second reading, Paul removes the confusion created by the Judaizers in the minds of the new Gentile Christians of Galatia. He clearly conveys the good news that it is Jesus' death on the cross, which brings one's salvation and not Jewish heritage or practice of Torah laws. Paul reminds us that the mission of each member of the Church is to bear witness to the saving power of the cross of Christ through a life of sacrificial, self-giving service.

In today's Gospel, Luke describes the fulfilment of the prophetic promise made by Isaiah in Jesus' commissioning of 72 disciples to preach the Gospel or the good news of God's love and salvation in towns and villages in preparation for his own visit. The persons who had lived with Jesus and understood his mission and his work now go out to continue his mission. Some think this has a symbolic reference to the seventy nations descended from Noah described in Genesis chapter ten. Most probably, it reflects the time of Luke's community and sets forth the outline form, expected of a missionary. The disciples go in pairs and not as isolated individuals. The number two also adds to the witness value required in the testimony of two people. The disciples are called to demonstrate, in every aspect of their lives, the love they bring to the world.

Jesus gives the paired disciples "travel tips" for their missionary journey. They must be walking witnesses of God's providence, relying on the hospitality of others, living very simple lives, preaching the Good News and healing the sick.

Dear Friends, like those seventy-two persons we too are called to proclaim that the kingdom of God is at hand and this has to be proclaimed through our lives. It is necessary for us to lend a listening ear to the sick and lonely, helpless and elderly and give them that consolation and healing. We have to give them the peace of Jesus.

**We are in NAIDOC week with the theme "Get up, Stand up and Show up".** Reflecting upon the mission of preaching the good news, let us also open our hearts to listen to the stories of our First Nations people and show the world our spirit of togetherness.

**THANK YOU:** Sincerely I express my heartfelt thanks to you all for making the Installation Ceremony successful. It was a time of our unity and fraternity. The Archbishop and other guests appreciated our liturgical celebration and hospitality. All credit goes to you. Let us together work for the Kingdom of God.

### National Aboriginal and Islander Day of Observance

#### What does NAIDOC stand for?


NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee. To understand what all that means though, we need a little bit of a history lesson. In 1955, the Day of mourning or Aborigines Day was moved from the Sunday before January 26 to the first Sunday in July. It was shifted because people wanted to focus more on celebrating First Nations cultures rather than protesting. The National Aborigines Day Observance committee was then created in 1956 to organize national events. In 1975 it was decided to celebrate for a whole week rather than just one day. NAIDOC week was born! Then in 1991, NAIDOC Week expanded to recognise Torres Strait Islander people and cultures. And that's why it's called NAIDOC Week.

#### Why is NAIDOC Week important?

NAIDOC Week is important as it is an opportunity for learning, connection and community.

It gives First Nations people and non-Indigenous people the opportunity to celebrate and connect with community and country. It is a chance for everyone not just First Nations people to celebrate all aspects of First Nations history and cultures.

As well as this, with its origins of being one of the first major civil rights gatherings in the World. NAIDOC Week is an important time to reflect on the challenges faced by First Nations people – to look at how far we have come and how far we have to go.
